COMPLEX CARE

When the term complex care is used, it is intended to highlight circumstances in which youth have a variety of identified needs across multiple domains that have been unmet, often over long periods of time, by behavioral health, child welfare, probation, education and other systems. As a result, these youth need high intensity, individualized treatment options to better resolve challenges and address their needs.
